- Fill out & bring an audition form and ACCURATELY COMPLETED conflict sheet. Paper copies will be available at auditions if you need to fill it out there.
- Arrive at least 5-10 minutes prior to your audition time (more if you need to fill out the audition form there).

ABOUT THE SHOW:

Friendships challenged, a world changed, and two young people trying to make sense of it together.

Neighbors Josh and Emma are best friends. But something has happened in their town. When a Black man is killed by a police officer, Emma and Josh have questions—real questions that deserve real answers. With so much going on, the two don't know how to keep their friendship from being pulled apart. Layered with compassion and humor, this play invites you into the living rooms of these two families (one Black and one White) as they wrestle with how to help their children make sense of what happened. Playwright Cheryl D. West invites you to walk alongside Josh and Emma as they confront uncertainty within their own town and seek to plant the seeds of change in their community.

Youtheatre's award-winning *Young Heroes of Conscience Series* has long been dedicated to highlighting courageous youth and stories of social justice. We are proud to contribute to another important national conversation with this all-too-relevant story.



AUDITION NOTICE: SCENES & CHARACTERS

Fort Wayne Youtheatre seeks 12-16 actors ages 8- Adult for this Fort Wayne premiere. We encourage performers of all races and ethnicities, genders and abilities to audition. Reading skills required.

CHARACTERS...

HARTLEY HOUSEHOLD:

- **Emma Hartley:** Youth Female (Approx. 8-11). White. She has a childlike naiveness towards the problems her community is met with. She is upbeat, a token "only child".
- **Sue Hartley:** Adult Female. White. Emma's mom. She wants the best for her daughter and those she cares about. She is slightly naive to the resounding effects on her community.
- **Uncle Manny:** Older Teen or Adult Male. White. Emma's police officer uncle. An upbeat, jovial police officer that takes pride in protecting his community. He has moral conflicts surrounding past events.

PERKINS HOUSEHOLD:

- **Josh Perkins:** Youth Male (Approx. 8-11). Black. Emma's slightly more realistic neighbor and best friend. He is surrounded by conflicted feelings and opinions following the event and is confused about how to feel.
- Malcolm Perkins: Teenage Male (Approx 16). Black. Josh's older brother. He is confident and passionate about what he believes in.
- Calvin Perkins: Adult Male. Black. Josh & Malcolm's dad. He is wise and fatherly, a warm figure who wants to protect his family.
- **Bella Perkins:** Adult Female. Black. Josh & Malcolm's mom. She is passionate about the well-being of her children and community.
- Ms. Garcia: Adult Female. Josh & Emma's teacher. Cares deeply about her students.

THE KIDS:

- Daniel: White, 8. Confident and charming.
- Sophia: Black, 8. Kind and passionate.
- Ling: Asian, 8. Quiet and sweet.
- Omar: Latinx, 8. The new kid. Nervous and kind.

Note: Listed ages are that of the characters. Actors need not be the exact age, but be able to play it. We are currently open to parents and teachers being played by adults OR high school age actors.

AUDITION NOTICE: AUDITION TIPS

Remember...

Don't think of an audition as a competition. Think of it as a chance to do something you love to do- perform! For however long you're up there, that role is yours. Make the most of it. Be creative. HAVE FUN!

The Directors are all rooting for you to succeed!

General Audition Typs...

• BE PREPARED.

Directors are impressed by actors who care. Know the show. Read the script. Listen to the music.

- BE ON TIME.
- ALWAYS PAY ATTENTION.

Listen quietly to others. It is polite...PLUS you learn from what they do.

- REMEMBER, YOU ARE AUDITIONING ON-STAGE & OFF. The directors are always watching.
- DON'T APOLOGIZE OR MAKE EXCUSES.

Director's can tell when you're sick. Just do the best you can.

GIVE IT 150%.

Do your absolute best, then...

· LET IT GO.

Whatever happens happens. IT'S ONLY A PLAY!!!

Reading Audition Tips...

• BE SEEN!

Don't hide behind your script.

Hold it about chest level so we can see your face.

• BE HEARD!!

Project your voice so directors can hear & understand you.

• BE CONFIDENT (even if it's fake)

Plant your feet. Use your face, your hands, your whole body to communicate.

LISTEN TO YOUR FELLOW ACTORS!!!

Pay attention & react to what they do.

DON'T JUST READ, ACT!!!!

Directors know you can read. Show them you can ACT!

Youtheatre Musical Vocal Audition Procedure...

- Enter
- Go to your spot in front of the Directors & plant your feet firmly on the ground.
- Say "Hello, my name is (YOUR NAME) and I will be singing (SONG TITLE) from (TITLE OF SHOW)."
- Make eye contact with the Music Director/Accompanist & nod to them when you're ready to start.
- Sing your song. Be loud. Be clear. Be confident. Don't just sing- ACT.
- When finished singing, say "Thank you" before walking away.
- Exit.

JOSH, BELLA, EMMA

JOSH: Mom, what happened?

BELLA: I've had a little stomach ache all day. Sorry I wasn't on the porch. How was school?

JOSH: It was fine except...

EMMA: It was like all the teachers had a secret..

JOSH: Yeah.

EMMA: A secret that they didn't want us to know about.

JOSH: Even our teacher was crying. Made me nervous.

BELLA: Honey, I'm sure she didn't mean to make you nervous.

EMMA: Is what's on TV a part of it? Did Sue say...

BELLA: Sue?! Do you always call your mother Sue?

EMMA: Well, that's her name. Did she say my Uncle Manny was ok?

BELLA Oh, honey I'm sure he is. Your mother never said otherwise. There has been an incident in the community but I'm sure your mother would prefer to discuss it with you herself.

MALCOLM, BELLA, JOSH, CALVIN

MALCOLM

What if it there had been a white man in the car? Would the police still have shot him? No!

CALVIN

They probably wouldn't even have stopped the car. Pass the potatoes.

JOSH

I don't understand. Why wouldn't they have stopped the car?

BELLA

Sometimes, Josh, white people are treated better than Black people.

JOSH

Do I have to eat these string beans?

BELLA

And that's not right. Everyone should be treated fairly.

JOSH

So, I don't have to eat these string beans?

CALVIN

Eat a few, boy.

MALCOLM

I'll tell you what, if a cop stops me...

CALVIN

You are going to follow his direction.

BELLA

Malcolm don't talk with your mouth full.

SIDE #2 (Continued...)

CALVIN

If a cop stops you, you will fall in line and do exactly...

MALCOLM

We're not in school, Dad. No need for principal speak. Plus, you don't tell the white students to fall in line.

CALVIN

I don't have to.

JOSH

So you have different rules for the white kids, dad?

CALVIN

No I don't have different rules for them, the world does.

BELLA

Calvin, he's a little young to...

CALVIN

We can't continue to coddle him Bella. This thing is at our doorstep. He's got to be prepared. Being the color you two boys are means you're facing a different system, a system of inherent bias.

SIDE #3 JOSH, EMMA

JOSH

Don't you think we should get to the bus stop?

EMMA

Josh, we'll hear the bus when it makes the turn.

JOSH

But if we miss it...I...I never like to be late.

EMMA

Josh, you worry too much...

JOSH

I really don't like to be late.

JOSH (CONT'D)

I think I hear the bus.

EMMA

Josh, will you stop with the bus already??? Now, since we're best friends you'll always stick by my side at school, right? Especially with recess.

JOSH

I guess.

EMMA

I'm just so glad you moved in so now I have a best friend right next door to play with everyday.

JOSH

I guess. Since my brother became a teenager, he really doesn't have much to do with me anymore.

EMMA, SUE

SUE

You're awfully quiet tonight. What's wrong?

SUE (CONT'D)
Oh honey, what's wrong?

EMMA

I don't know what to do. People are so angry. Even Josh. I don't know how to talk about it. How can Uncle Manny be so good but people think he's not, and they don't even know him?

SUE

Because they think mistreatment by certain cops is a pattern...

EMMA

Pattern? Like my blanket and the clothes I wear?

SUE

Yes, but this is an unfair pattern that people feel keeps getting repeated. A pattern where some people may not treat others fairly.

EMMA

But why would they treat people bad on purpose?

SUE

Well, for some the job isn't a good fit. Some get angry because they fear for their own lives, but we can all work to set a new pattern

SIDE #4 (Continued...)

EMMA

I really try but I...

SUE

What's the but? But what?

EMMA

I just don't want to lose my friend.

Do you think you could as Uncle Manny not to come tomorrow?

SUE

But why...

EMMA

Because people are hating on cops now and if I bring one to school, they'll be hating on me even more. Even Josh. He was the one person that used to treat me nice... Until all these bad things started happening.

SUE

I'm really sorry some of the kids are still acting a little mean to you.

EMMA

(nods yes)

Yeah, I used to pretend that they liked me even if they didn't.

EMMA

But then I got Josh and I didn't have to pretend anymore. He really was my friend.

SUE

(pulling Emma into embrace)

I'm sorry honey that you're having a difficult time of it.

MANNY, JOSH

JOSH (Waving) Hi Officer Manny.

MANNY

Hey partner. Thought I'd check in on Emma this morning but...
They meet up between the yards.

MANNY (CONT'D)

I don't think Emma's having a good morning.

JOSH

Yeah, she usually doesn't. You know because of school. She gets sad a lot at school.

MANNY

She does? Really? Josh can you keep a secret just between us?

JOSH

I guess so but I'm not...not the best secret keeper.

MANNY

Think Emma's been more upset than I realized. So keep a good watch out for her today, ok? And I'm going to do us all a favor and skip career day...

JOSH

But that's all Emma's been talking about...You have to come...

MANNY

I think Josh, me being there adds too much extra pressure.



SIDE #5 (Continued)...)

JOSH

But you can't give in to pressure, Officer Manny. No matter who it is. That's what my mom says. People need to see good cops like you. Even my Dad said so.

JOSH

You saved my brother. But can I ask you something? If there was a really bad cop, and you knew about it, would you tell on him so he couldn't hurt anybody else?

MANNY

Gotta go. We 'll continue this later.

JOSH

Please come today, Officer Manny. Emma's counting on it...I'm counting on it.

JOSH, DANIEL, EMMA, LING, SOPHIA

DANIEL

Now I always pick the teams and I say he doesn't belong. And if you keep it up, Josh, you won't get to play either. So, Sophia, you're on my team...

JOSH

(Takes a courage breath, then) Step off Daniel!

DANIEL

What did you say? I know I didn't hear what I thought I heard.

JOSH

You did. I said step off.

DANIEL

What the heck are you trying to prove, Josh? Yesterday you were on our side.

JOSH

But today I'm...I'm on everybody's side. And I don't care what you say, you're not going to pressure me to be on the wrong side.

EMMA

Yeah, and you're acting prejudice. You need to set a new pattern.

DANIEL

Shut up Emma.

EMMA

See that's your pattern Daniel. Being mean when somebody doesn't agree with you. You like to scare people but I'm not scared of you anymore.

DANIEL

You're crazy. Absolute psycho.

JOSH

No, she's not. Emma is very smart.

SOPHIA

Daniel, give it up. Emma called it right. It's hard being new. I remember when I was new and nobody liked me...

LING

We still don't.

SOPHIA

You made fun of me, saying my hair beads made too much noise and that my hair stunk 'cause I had grease in it.

LING

I don't even remember that.

SOPHIA

Well, I do. I used to cry every morning wishing lould go to a different school. I hated it here.

EMMA

Yeah, but that's our old pattern. If we just give each other a chance we could...

JOSH

(Pointedly to Emma)

We could become friends. Best friends.
