Theatre

I am going to see a play by Fort Wayne Youtheatre. It is at First Presbyterian Theatre.

Here is the building. This is what I will see from the outside.



Parking

This is where we can park our car.

The lot is right next to the building.



Entrance

There is one way to get into the building.



Upstairs Lobby

Once you get into the building, you will be in the Upstairs Lobby.



Tickets

I may have to stand in a line to get my ticket for the show.



McKay Hall

During the show, I can use McKay Hall to take a break.

I should find McKay Hall before I go down to the theatre.



Finding the Theatre

The theatre and theatre lobby are in the lower part of the building.

There are two ways to get downstairs to the theatre.



Option #1

The Steps

I can take steps to walk down to the theatre lobby.



Option #2

The Elevator

I can take the elevator down to the theatre lobby.



Theatre Lobby

Once I get downstairs, I will be in the theatre lobby.

This is where I can wait to enter the theatre when it is time for the show.



Theatre Lobby

I will see an area serving concessions and a little store. There will be benches to sit on and there will be art on the walls to look at. I can sit here and wait until the doors to the theatre open.



Restrooms

There is a short hallway that will take me to the restrooms.

The women's restroom is at the end of the hall.



Restrooms

The men's restroom is up the stairs at the end of the hallway.

I can use the restroom before, after, or during the show.



Family Restroom

If I need a private or family restroom, I can take the elevator up to the Upstairs Lobby.



Theatre Usher

When it is time to enter the theatre, I will give my ticket to an usher at the door.

They will give me a program for the play. This will have information about the show inside to read.



The Performance

Now I am ready to enter the theatre. The ushers have "opened the house," which means it is time to go into the theatre.

In this theatre, the audience sits in the seats facing the stage.



Choosing a Seat

When I walk into the theatre, I will be able to pick a seat to sit in.

I can be as close or as far away from the stage as I want to be.



During the Show

The lights dim when the show is ready to start. I may hear announcements or music.

If the show sounds are too loud, I can cover my ears.



During the Show

If I need a break during the show, I exit to the theatre lobby or McKay Hall.

If something is funny, I am allowed to laugh. If something is scary, it is okay to gasp.



Intermission

Some shows have a 10-15 minute break called intermission. If the show I'm attending has intermission, I can remain in my seat, stand up and stretch, or walk to the theatre lobby.



Intermission

Intermission is a busy, crowded time. I may have to wait in lines to leave the theatre, to enter the restroom, or to get a snack.

Ushers will announce when it's time to go back to my seat.



After the Show

When the show ends, I can clap and cheer to show my appreciation for the actors onstage and technicians backstage.



Leaving

Once I am out of the theatre, I can take the steps or the elevator to go back to the Upstairs Lobby.
